Outdoor Arts Calossary

Throughout the sector, you'll hear various acronyms, terms and organisations used, which we know can be a little confusing. While not exhaustive, here's a list of some of those words, phrases and companies.

Out door Arts uk

101 Outdoor Arts

The Corn Exchange Newbury's creation space. Based on Greenham Common, it's a National Centre for Arts in Public Space which provides many opportunities for the sector, including creative residencies. @101OutdoorArts

ACE: Arts Council England

A government-funded body dedicated to promoting the performing, visual and literary arts in England. Funding is available via Project Grants, Developing Your Creative Practice Grants and the National Portfolio Organisations. @ace_national

Arts Council of Ireland / Chomhairle Ealaíon

The Irish government agency for developing the arts. It works in partnership with artists, arts organisations, public policymakers and others to build a central place for the arts in Irish life. *@artscouncil ie*

Arts Council of Wales / Cyngor Celfyddydau Cymru

Helps people to make, present and exhibit the arts. It works with artists and organisations to reach as many people as possible. And it researches ways to protect and sustain creative activities in Wales. @*Arts_Wales_*

AIF: The Association of Independent Festivals

The UK's leading non-profit festival trade association and organisers of the Festival Congress. Created to represent and empower independent festivals. @*AIF_UK*

AONB: Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty

An area of countryside in England, Wales or Northern Ireland that has been designated for conservation due to its significant landscape value. Many have cultural programmes attached. @NAAONB

Articulation Scotland

An organisation for the support and development of circus, outdoor arts

BAFA: British Arts Festival Association

The leading network and development agency for UK arts festivals. Its membership includes a broad variety of organisations across the UK. *@BritArtsFests*

BID: Business Improvement District

A business-led and business-funded body formed to improve a defined commercial area. Many support cultural programmes, particularly around developing high streets and commercial areas. @BritishBIDs

Carnival

In the UK this largely indicates the Caribbean Carnival tradition, exemplified by the scale of the Notting Hill Carnival. It also refers to the South American Carnival tradition, such as the Rio Carnival; older carnival and fairground sideshow work in the UK and USA; and the Illuminated Carnival movement, best seen in Somerset in the autumn.

Circostrada

A networking organisation based in France that works to develop and structure the fields of circus and street arts in Europe and beyond. @circostrada

CPP: Creative People and Places

An Arts Council England funding programme that focuses on parts of the country where involvement in creativity and culture is significantly below the national average. It has been running for over a decade.

Creative Scotland

The public body that supports the arts, screen and creative industries across Scotland on behalf of everyone who lives, works or visits the country, enabling people and organisations to work in and experience the arts. @*CreativeScots*

EMCCAN: East Midlands

Caribbean Carnival Arts Network Created to support and encourage best practice artistic and management delivery for four major East Midlands Caribbean Carnival Arts organisations and to provide leadership to the sector.

Global Streets

A 12-partner national network that presents international outdoor arts events in communities living and working in places which are underserved by the arts, managed by festival.org @festivaldotorg

IPSO (formerly SSO): Investment

Principles Support Organisation An Arts Council England-funded organisation that receives regular funding, similar to an NPO, but its role is to provide support to its sector to help them deliver the ACE investment principles.

Investment Principles

Four principles created by Arts Council England to help deliver the Let's Create strategy for 2020-30. The four principles are 'Ambition & Quality', 'Dynamism', 'Environmental Responsibility', and 'Inclusivity & Relevance'.

ITC: Independent Theatre Council

Represents, supports and develops the professional performing arts in the UK (NB: OAUK members get discounted ITC training). @*itc_arts*

ISACS: Irish Street Arts, Circus

& Spectacle Network An organisation dedicated to supporting, encouraging and empowering the street arts, circus and spectacle art forms in Ireland and Northern Ireland. @ISACSIreland

LA: Local Authority

An organisation that is officially responsible for all the public services and facilities in a particular area. Most have cultural and community engagement programmes. @LGAcomms

Let's Create

Arts Council England's strategy for the next decade: 'By 2030, we want England to be a country in which the creativity of each of us is valued and given the chance to flourish. A country where every one of us has access to a remarkable range of high-quality cultural experiences'.

Mela Partnership

A national membership organisation, managed by Nutkhut, which supports the development of the sector and supports and mentors the next generation of Mela makers. *@melapartnership @nutkhutuk*

NASA: National Association of Street Artists

A networking community of artists and makers who create and perform outside, run by a volunteer Steering Group (Mission Control). @NASAUK

NPO: National Portfolio Organisation

An organisation that receives regular funding from Arts Council England, traditionally for four years.

OAUK: OutdoorArtsUK

The national membership and strategic organisation that aims to bring together the many diverse parts of the outdoor arts sector. @OutdoorArtsPRO

Out There Arts

An independent arts development organisation based in The Drill Hall in Great Yarmouth which collaborates with circus and outdoor artists worldwide, delivering creative opportunities for artists and communities. @outtherearts

SIRF: Stockton International Riverside Festival

A long-running festival in the North East, which has a strong national and international programme. @SIRF_Stockton

UKCCA: UK Centre for Carnival Arts

A dedicated organisation and centre promoting excellence within carnival arts. @*carnivalukcca*

Walk the Plank

A producing company, based in Salford, with a vision and ambition to bring their highly spirited outdoor arts experience to all points of the compass, as well as provide training and development for the sector. @walktheplank

AIE: Attitude is Everything

An organisation that works at connecting disabled people with music and live event industries to improve access together. @attitudetweets

An international street performance agency founded in 1991, which supplies the best UK street theatre and outdoor arts to regional and worldwide audiences and champions the most inspiring talent. @FoolsParadiseUK

GDIF: Greenwich+Docklands International Festival

A large outdoor arts festival in London, which includes Greenwich Fair and Dancing City, managed by festival.org @GDIFestival

LUTN: Light Up the North

A network of northern light festivals which share their collective expertise to support both the development of the partner festivals and the wider sector. @*lutnorth*

Mela

Mela originates from the Indian subcontinent. The word comes from the Sanskrit 'to meet' and is related to 'milana': to tune. It is commonly used to describe a large gathering of people celebrating artistic, religious or political events, a fair or festival.

Without Walls

The UK's leading consortium of festivals and organisations dedicated to raising the profile of the UK outdoor arts sector. @WWconsortium

XTRAX

Based in Manchester, one of the UK's leading specialists in national and international outdoor development, providing networking, information and training to all parts of the sector. @*XtraxArts*
